

### Guy Road Shared Pathway Project

February 2023

This newsletter has been published to keep all stakeholders informed of the works as they progress.

#### **Background**

The Guy Road pathway project is a 6 kilometre long, 2.5 metre wide shared pathway linking the Corinella Community Centre to the Bass Valley Primary School (via Tenby Point).

This pathway was identified as a high priority on Council's endorsed Advocacy Priorities list.

Significant community consultation occurred with stakeholders and community groups to inform the design of the pathway.

This project is funded by the Victorian State Government's Growing Suburbs Fund (\$1.4 million) and Council (\$1.4 million) totalling approximately \$2.8 million.

# February Progress Update

Due to inclement weather and flooding in some areas, works on the low-lying gravel path sections between Brick Kiln Road and Joseph Road and between Tenby Point and Cemetery Road (north) were delayed until mid-January 2023.

Contractors have completed the concrete footpath and boardwalk sections. The section of pathway between Jamieson Street and Brick Kiln Road has been completed and the section between Joseph Road and Argent Road is nearing completion.

The section of pathway between Brick Kiln Road and Joseph Road is underway.

The footbridge piling works have been completed.

## **Upcoming Works – March 2023**

The section of pathway between Joseph Road and Argent Road will be completed in March along with the gravel path link between Cemetery Road (North) and Argent Road.

The Melbourne Water crossing footbridge will be completed along with the gravel path link between Brick Kiln Road and Joseph Road up to the Melbourne Water Culvert.

As soon as sections of pathway are connected, these sections will be made available to the public.

It is anticipated the works

to be completed in April 2023.
